The September 11th National Memorial Trail Alliance is working to connect a network of trails and greenways to create a unique American experience. You can help us build new sections to create an unbroken 1,300-mile trail and greenway. More than 50% of the route is off-road. Along the way, travelers will connect with communities and their historic, industrial, and cultural points of interest, from historical parks to wildlife refuges and many memorials.

For some, traveling the 9/11 National Memorial Trail will be a pilgrimage or a grand adventure. For others, it will be a family stroll one afternoon. For everyone, it will be a journey of hope and remembrance, honoring the resilience and perseverance we have as Americans.

Join us today as we partner with the National Park Service, federal, state, county and local governments, and many friends to connect the memorials through this American treasure.

The 9/11 National Memorial Trail honors those who were lost and celebrates our resilience and perseverance as a country, our majestic landscapes, and our historical, cultural, and industrial heritage.

The trail creates an unbroken, 1,300-mile system of roads, trails, and greenways that is more than 50% off-road today—linking the three national 9/11 memorials to other sites and experiences that connect us to American history.
